TAG SALE

What a chilly day we had for our Tag Sale on Saturday, October 14! When we arrived for setup at 7:00 a.m. it was still dark out, too. But there are lights at the High Plains Community Center Pavilion, and what an ideal place for our tag sale and bake sale! There is no charge for us from the town; it sprinkled a bit, but we were covered; the town perfectly placed sixteen picnic tables for us in the space; we could string clothesline in-between the posts for hanging items; there are trash cans available; and parking is convenient for customers as well as for loading and unloading. Wow, what a variety of great items there were for sale, all donated by garden club members!

Members were also awesome in placing their items on designated tables with like items together - just like in the stores. It's our third annual tag sale and our experience helped in tagging the items, too, prior to bringing them in on the day of the sale. (We know that customers will suggest another price if they feel the price is too high.) Our profit for the day was \$843.45 (Tag Sale) and \$253 (Bake Sale) making a total of \$1096.45. There were no expenses. Some items are still being sold on Facebook Marketplace and will be adding to our profits. Remaining items were donated to Savers, Goodwill, the Case Memorial Library Book Sale, or returned to the donors.

AWARDS AT AQUA TURF

The Garden Club of Orange proudly nominated Lana Ho, Maryellen Bespuda, Patti Logioco, and Raye Maclellan to receive awards at the October 2023 Awards Meeting. Fifteen Garden Club of Orange members happily attended the meeting and luncheon to cheer for our nominees, surrounded by 350 members of Garden Clubs throughout the state. It was an outstanding occasion.

The FGCCT, Inc. Award, The Lillian M. Rathbun Award, is presented annually to an individual involved in all phases of garden club work. This award is considered the highest award presented to an individual garden club member. To quote, "Our 2023 Lillian M. Rathbun Award recipient is the incomparable Lana Ho of The Garden Club of Orange".

Maryellen Bespuda received the FGCCT, Inc. Horticulture Tribute Award for Youth. This Award encompasses all the work Maryellen has accomplished through the years; revitalizing with her husband, Walter, the Country Fair which had been defunct for many years; under her leadership and in collaboration with the Orange Historical Society, restored the Historic Herb Garden at the Stone – Otis House; Maryellen opens her gardens to groups of school children, who learn her gardening methods for "what to plant, where and why".

A Horticulture Award, The Joyce P. Harris Award recipient is Patti Logioco. This award is presented for outstanding horticultural achievement by a club, individual, or group in their community. Patti participated in many Civic Committee endeavors, and as a member of the Orange 2022 Bicentennial Committee, organized and financially supported a club project planning and researching ever-blooming tulip and daffodil bulbs, supplying soil amendments and treatment, and bulb protection methods, including planting the bulbs in wire caging.

Raye MacLellan was awarded the FGCCT, Inc. Club Certificate of Appreciation. Established in 1978, this award allows each individual club to recognize outstanding work, length of service or whatever is applicable to honor one of its members in a fitting manner. Raye exemplifies the best qualities of a garden club member. She has actively participated on the board and in all club projects and in many club offices. At the same time, Raye has willingly headed the Sunshine Committee, making calls to members who are sick or homebound, delivers a plant or flowers to members who undergo surgery or have been hospitalized. Raye sends Get Well cards and condolence cards to members and their families and telephones members who do not have email. She generously contributes to the Arbor Day Foundation to plant trees in memory of members and their spouses

In January, committee chairs are requested to submit their reports to the Club President. These reports are sent on to the Federated Garden Clubs of Connecticut for their review. As these reports are read, valuable information is gleaned by the reviewer, who sets the report aside for the possibility of being "Award Worthy". And that is why we received many awards for which we did not apply. What a delightful surprise when our club received the following awards: Report submitted by Lisa Stackpole. FGCCT, Inc. Garden Therapy Club Certificate of Achievement to The Garden Club of Orange which meets monthly from September to June with an average of twenty-five residents who participate in the Garden Therapy program with nature and holiday themes.
